The Pre's Trail Run is Scheduled for May 26

The Oregon Track Club is hosting the Pre's Trail Run on May 26 in Alton Baker Park. This memorial event was first held in 1975, a few months after Steve Prefontaine's death. The run was not held for several years until the OTC decided to bring back the popular event last year.

The <u>5K run/walk</u> starts at 6:30 p.m. The event is limited to 400 entries. The run is open to all age groups, with cash awards given to the top three finishers (men and women) in each age group. Registered runners/walkers will receive a Nike Pre's Trail Run t-shirt and other goodies.

Pre-registration fee is \$30, day of race is \$35. Packet pickup at the Nike Eugene store on May 25 from 4:00-7:00 p.m. OTC members with a membership card will receive an OTC gift at packet pickup. **Go here to register**.

Pre's Trail is a four-mile bark trail named after the legendary University of Oregon and Olympic runner Steve Prefontaine. The trail is a Eugene Historic Landmark.



Demand for OTC Merchandise Has Exploded

The sales of OTC branded merchandise have grown dramatically in the past two years. "If you put the OTC brand on anything, it will sell," Molly Wildman, OTC Treasurer, said.

Branded apparel and accessory sales generated \$137,000 in revenue in 2021. This revenue is used to help fund all the OTC programs and administrative operations. The OTC Executive Committee is projecting merchandise sales in 2022 of over \$177,000.





OTC merchandise sales began to increase in September 2020 when the new OTC website was launched. The three primary reasons for the sales jump were the presentation of the merchandise on the new website, a wider selection of items, and the revival of the OTC Merchandise Committee.

Approximately 30% of the current online sales come from out-of-state orders. The top five states generating orders outside of Oregon are California, Washington, Texas, Michigan, and Illinois. OTC is not currently accepting orders from outside the United States.

All merchandise is selling well; however, these items are the most popular: Singlets, Pegasus shoes, backpacks, sweatshirts, and hats.

One of the nation's premier Masters events, the <u>OTC Hayward Classic</u>, will be on Saturday, May 7 at Hayward Field. The meet will include 16 agegroup events this year as well as the 4x100 relay.

The Hayward Classic offers Masters athletes, 25 years and older, the opportunity to compete in newly renovated Hayward Field. Medals will be awarded to the first, second, and third-place finishers in each age division of each event.

Entry forms must be received by April 23. Late entries must be received by April 28 and must include a \$40 late fee.

Two OTC Masters Excel At USATF Indoor Nationals


The 2022 USATF Masters Indoor Championships were held on March 18-20 in New York City at "The Armory."

OTC Masters athlete **Alison Wood** (W45-49) competed in the High Jump, winning her age group with a 1.55m jump. **David Gates** (M50-54) competed in the Pole Vault, jumping 2.90m for a third-place age group finish. David also competed in the Indoor Pentathlon (M50-54) Long Jump (4.39m), Shot Put (9.56m), High Jump (1.37m), 60 Hurdles (10.90), and the 1,000m (3:52.53), achieving a second-place age group finish in all events.

The Armory has hosted track meets for over 100 years and now has a 200-meter banked Mondo track and complete field event facilities.

Clarke Holds Pole Vault Mark

Chris Clarke, a part-time resident of both Eugene and Petaluma, CA, currently has the world-leading pole vault mark in his age group (60-64). Clarke cleared 12-5 ½ at a meet in Berkeley, CA, on February 19.

For the past two years, Tye Van Schoiack has been the go-to massage therapist for Oregon Track Club Elite. And for good reason.

Not only is Van Schoiack equipped with the requisite technical skills to work on elite track and field athletes, but he also fully understands the language of world-class runners.

Van Schoiack was a two-time all-American in the 3,000-meter steeplechase at the University of

Oregon under coach Bill Dellinger in the early 1990s. He placed third at the 1992 NCAA Outdoor Championships for the Ducks and went on to set his personal best of 8:38.07 in the semifinals of the U.S. Olympic Track and Field Trials in New Orleans.

No Russian or Belarusian Athletes At the Prefontaine Classic

The Wanda Diamond League track and field competitions have banned Russian and Belarusian athletes

from its 14 meets for the "foreseeable future" following Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

One of the Diamond League meets is the Prefontaine Classic set for May 27-28 at Hayward Field in Eugene. The Pre Classic is the only Diamond League meet held in the United States.

Kids 16 and 17 years old can now apply to join *Crew22*, the volunteer team that will support the meet. Volunteer registration launched in November 2021 with the provision that volunteers were required to be 18 or older at the time of the event to apply.
